Updated COVID Protocols from the Archdiocese of Boston

The Archdiocese of Boston has updated their protocols with regard to COVID safety measures. These measures take effect on the weekend of Labor Day (September 4 and 5).

Regarding Safety Precautions at Masses:

All parishes are mandated to have clearly marked areas of the Church for people who want to wear masks and be sitting only near people who are wearing masks.

Here at St. John's, pews on the north side of the church will be marked with blue tape for parishioners who want to wear masks. Please do not sit in this area without wearing a mask. Thank you for your cooperation in helping to make everyone feel safe and welcome at Mass.

Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests September 16 at 7PM

On the third Thursday of every month at 7PM in the lower chapel, we will be offering a Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests. This is something recommended by the Congregation of the Clergy and, in this our day and age, sorely needed. This secular age of ours presents some unique challenges to the Church and to Her ministerial priesthood. The current priest shortage adds to the stress that many priests feel and can be a challenge to their spiritual life and pastoral service. Thursday of Holy Week our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist and priesthood, it is an ideal day to pray for priests before the Blessed Sacrament. The Holy Hour will consist of: adoration; the rosary; litany and prayer of petitions; silent prayer and benediction. "During that month I met with many holy Priests, and yet I saw that even though the sublime dignity of Priesthood raises them higher than the Angels, they are still but weak and imperfect men. If holy Priests, whom Our Lord in the Gospel calls the salt of the earth, have need of our prayers, how much more the struggling and the lukewarm?"

CROSS ROADS

Isaiah 50:4-9; Psalm 116:1-6, 8-9; James 2:14-18; Mark 8:27-35

Today's reading from Isaiah is the third of his four "servant of the Lord" oracles. Isaiah is so determined to serve the Lord that he willingly submits himself to insults and beatings. Suffering servant that he was, he did not refuse the vocation that was given to him: "I have set my face like flint." He placed all his faith and trust in the Lord. Isaiah lived his faith. In today's Psalm, the psalmist praises the Lord for rescuing him from mortal danger: "For he has freed my soul from death...I shall walk before the Lord in the land of the living." The psalmist portrays death or evil as a trapper or hunter who ensnares prey. Sounds familiar, as in the prayer to Saint Michael "... Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil." The reading from the Letter of James reminds us that real faith is expressed and demonstrated by what we do. Faith is lifeless if it is not lived in love, sacrifice, service, and generosity.

In today's gospel, Jesus fulfills Isaiah's image of the suffering servant of the Lord. When Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" most of their answers reflect the popular notion that Jesus was a prophet and miracle worker. When Jesus asks the disciples, "But who do you say that I am?" it is Peter who says that Jesus is the Christ (the Anointed, the Messiah). Jesus then tells his disciples that he would be rejected, suffer, die, and rise after three days. Peter was horrified. How could that happen to the Messiah? Peter was thinking as human beings think, not as God thinks. Perhaps Peter was ensnared in the popular notion that the Messiah would be a powerful temporal leader. Jesus then revealed to the disciples, and to us, the true meaning of faith and discipleship: to deny ourselves, take up our individual crosses, and follow his example of doing the will of the Father with selflessness. faith, trust, service, generosity, and compassion.

Jesus was determined to do the Father's will and to complete his mission of salvation. We are called to imitate Jesus. We sometimes fail. But by the grace of God, we can persevere. Saint Padre Pio said, "God will not allow you to be lost if you persist in your determination not to lose HIM." Let us carry our crosses that we might walk before the Lord in the land of the living.
