Monday Zoom Rosary



Protecting Gods Children Training Workshop (PGC)

In person PGC training will be held at St. John's Parish Center on Thursday, July 11, at 6PM and Saturday, July 13, at 9AM. Ministry volunteers who work with children, the disabled or elderly are required to attend this training at least once. If it has been more than 5 years since you last attended, we recommend that you take the course again to be aware of the current tools and knowledge to recognize and prevent abuse. The 2-hour workshop will cover essential topics, including identifying signs of abuse, appropriate boundaries, how to respond to suspicions or disclosures of abuse, and the importance of maintaining a vigilant and nurturing environment for our young parishioners. St. John's has an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) on site! It is located in the lower Sacristy in the main church on the east wall in a white box. Should a cardiac event occur, the unit will walk you through the steps for use. Do you know where the closest exit is in the event of a fire? Did you know a fire pull box is located in the narthex north-side (left when leaving) and the lower Sacristy next to the AED? Additionally, we have multiple pull boxes and extinguishers in the Parish Center. Take a moment to look around.

CROSS ROADS

Job 38: 1, 8-11; Psalm 107: 23-26, 28-31; 2 Corinthians 5: 14-17; Mark 4: 35-41

In today's readings we see examples of humanity's struggles with fear, anxiety, despair, distress. This is not what the Lord had in mind when he created us. The Lord wants all of us to be at peace. The states of mind written above, and others that I could have added, were created by humanity. It seems there are times when humanity seems to have turned away from the Lord because in turning away some faith and trust in the Lord is lacking, and humanity stops listening to the promptings of the Lord's Holy Spirit. The Lord never leaves us, but when we are stubborn, there are times the Lord may leave us to our own devices as it is expressed in Psalm 81.

Job, a wealthy and just man, favored by the Lord, was in misery and despair. He lost his wealth, possessions, his home, his family, and suffered from an awful skin disease. His friends were no consolation when they spoke wrongly about the Lord. The Lord spoke to Job in the manner of a loving father or mother. The Lord gave a little history lesson regarding all creation, and that He, the Lord, was master of it all, someone who could speak to and set limits on the seas and all creation. In effect the Lord was telling Job to be patient in his suffering, to trust and have faith in the Lord. Job repented of his despair, and he prayed for the friends that misled him. In chapter 42 of the Book of Job, Job was restored. He received twice the wealth he had before, was cured of his disease, blessed with a long life and a family of seven sons and two daughters.

In today's gospel we see Jesus asleep in the boat with his disciples amid a horrific storm, giant waves, and strong winds. The disciples were terrified as the boat had already taken on water. They woke up Jesus. Jesus rebuked the wind and ordered the sea to be still and be quiet. The wind stopped, and there was a great calm. Jesus asked two questions of the disciples: why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?

The Lord asks the same of us. "If God is with us, who can stand against us?" Our fears, sorrows, challenges, distress, anxieties, disappointments, and despair cannot destroy us when we turn to the Lord. Sometimes patient endurance with the help of the Lord's grace makes us stronger, gives us the strength, courage, perseverance, and fortitude to endure these things calmly and peacefully. The Lord may not take the challenges away; but He always will be with us and give us the grace to endure. The Lord who created and can control the winds and the seas, will calm the storms that can rage within us when we look up to Him with faith, trust, and love.
