Protecting Gods Children Training Workshop (PGC)

In person PGC training will be held at St. John's Parish Center on Thursday, July 11, at 6PM and Saturday, July 13, at 9AM. Ministry volunteers who work with children, the disabled or elderly are required to attend this training at least once. If it has been more than 5 years since you last attended, we recommend that you take the course again to be aware of the current tools and knowledge to recognize and prevent abuse. The 2-hour workshop will cover essential topics, including identifying signs of abuse, appropriate boundaries, how to respond to suspicions or disclosures of abuse, and the importance of maintaining a vigilant and nurturing environment for our young parishioners. CROSS ROADS

By Deacon Tony Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24; Psalm 30:2, 4-6,11-13; 2 Corinthians 8: 7,9,13-15; Mark 5:21-43

When the Lord created us, He did not create death. He made us in HIS image and likeness, and He created us to have life, and to be imperishable. To paraphrase one commentator, The Lord fashioned us not just to have life, but to have a full life. It was Satan who brought sin and death into the world, in his envy of God and hatred of humanity. The Lord is about life, and against all things that can bring death to a soul, and those things that can diminish life, such as violence, illness, poverty, and shame. In our times the most hideous and barbaric of such things is the murder of the unborn, partially born, the born left to die, and assisted suicide of the sick and the elderly. The truth of the Lord's intentions is demonstrated in the person of Jesus Christ, who came to cure the afflicted, to raise others from the dead, and to defeat death by His resurrection from the tomb.

In today's gospel two desperate people had enough faith to believe in Jesus. Jairus, a synagogue official fought through the crowd to beg Jesus to cure his seriously ill twelve-year-old daughter. The other person was a woman who had been afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years, and who by tradition was labeled unclean and shamed, with no comforting contact with other people including her parents. Her life was lonely and diminished. She did not want to confront Jesus. She believed that if she only touched the hem of His garment, she would be cured. She did so and was cured. Jesus would go with Jairus, but first He wanted to know who touched him. Jesus approached her. Addressing her as "daughter," Jesus assured her that it was her faith that saved her and cured her affliction. But Jesus' word, "daughter", dispelled the shame, isolation, and fear.

On the way to the home of Jairus, the news came that Jairus' daughter had died. Jesus went to Jairus' home, and Jairus persevered in his faith. With Peter, James and John, Jesus entered the home. Declaring that the girl was only sleeping, Jesus was ridiculed by another synagogue official and the mourners. He sent everyone away except the girl's parents and His disciples. Jesus told the girl to arise. She did, and Jesus told her parents to give her something to eat. The lesson for us is that we too must **have faith**, **side with life**, and do what we can to help others overcome anything that can diminish their lives.
