## Our Lady of Mt. Carmel and the Brown Scapular

July 16<sup>th</sup> is the memorial of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel (Carmel in Hebrew means "Garden of God"). This feast day is dated through pious tradition as the day in the 13<sup>th</sup> century, that Our Lady of Mt. Carmel gave the brown scapular to St. Simon Stock, a Carmelite priest serving in England. St. Simon was exhorted by Our Lady to make available this scapular to the faithful.

Our Lady of Mt. Carmel will extend her patronage to the faithful who wear the scapular, especially at one's hour of death. The faithful in turn pledge:

- --Devotion to Our Lady and the teachings of the Church,
- --To live a chaste life according to one's station in life
- -- And to say the rosary daily or
- --Recite daily the Little Office of the BVM.
- --Observe the fasts of Church with abstinence from meat on Fridays.

One must be vested by a priest or deacon with the accompanying prayers.

For those interested, the vesting of the brown scapular of the Carmelites will be available after the Masses **THIS weekend**. For those that currently wear the scapular, one's vesture could be renewed.

## Morning Offering of the Brown Scapular

O my God, in union with the Immaculate Heart of Mary (here kiss the scapular as a sign of your consecration), I offer Thee the Precious Blood of Jesus from all the altars throughout the world, joining with It the offering of my every thought, word and action of this day. O my Jesus, I desire to gain every indulgence and merit I can, and I offer them together with myself, to Mary Immaculate, that She may best apply them to the interests of Thy most Sacred Heart. O Precious Blood of Jesus, save us! O Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us! O Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!

## **CROSS ROADS**

Amos 7: 12-15; Psalm 85: 9-14; Ephesians 1: 3-14; Mark 6: 7-13

Amos was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. Yet, as we know from last week, Amos was chosen by the Lord to prophesy in Israel. But Amos was not wanted by Amaziah, a priest of Bethel. Amaziah ordered Amos to leave Bethel and to flee to Judah. It was an insult, as if Amos were some sort of professional prophet for hire: "There earn your bread by prophesying but never again in Bethel...the king's sanctuary." Amos objected by declaring that it was the Lord who took him away from the flock and sent him to prophesy in Israel. In chapter 7: 17, Amos proclaimed to Amaziah that Amaziah and his family would die, his land parceled out, and that Israel would be exiled from its land. Indeed, Amaziah was an example of the obstinance and rebelliousness of the people of those times.

Like Amos, the Twelve were chosen from humble beginnings by God, through the person of Jesus Christ, to preach, in this case, the good news that God was among them, and salvation was at hand. They were sent out two by two, and instructed to take only a walking stick, but no food, money, or extra clothes. They were given authority to preach repentance, to heal, and to cast out demons. This would not only be a lesson in the power, majesty, and mercy of the Lord, but also a lesson in depending only on the Lord. If people did not welcome them, they were ordered to shake the dust off their feet in testimony against them. The Twelve, in trust and faith in the Lord, completed their mission, casting out demons and curing many people.

We, too, are called from our relatively humble beginnings to preach repentance and the good news of salvation. As Saint Paul says, the Father "has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens." What are those blessings? To name a few: love, joy, peace, salvation, life in this world, and eternally in the next life. But we must be holy and without blemish before him. We preach as much or more through our deeds instead of words. As some credit Saint Francis of Assisi as saying, "Preach always, and when necessary, use words." Look to the Lord. He is all about sacrificial love, truth, peace, and life. Like the Twelve, we are to clothe ourselves with his grace, and the blessings he has bestowed on us. He always is with us. There is no need for drama or for great deeds, just faith and trust in the Lord, and acting and speaking in ways that demonstrate the gifts, with which we have been blessed. Many little things can add up to great things. Leave the results to the Lord!
