The Pope Appoints Providence Bishop Richard G. Henning As Archbishop of Boston

The Most Rev. Richard G. Henning will succeed Cardinal Sean O'Malley, who turned 80 on June 29th, as the new Archbishop of Boston and Metropolitan of the Province of Boston, which encompasses seven dioceses in four New England states: Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Maine and Vermont. Bishop Henning, 59, was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Rockville Center in Long Island and has been the ordinary of Providence, RI, for the last year and a half. We offer our prayers and a heart-felt welcome to Archbishop-elect Richard Henning, who will be formally installed on October 31st, at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in the South End.

With the conclusion of the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, the first such congress in this country since before WWII, there was a prayerful encouragement that the worship and adoration of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, through His real presence in the Holy Eucharist, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, be further encouraged in parishes. In that in mind, St. John's, in addition to Friday mornings, will also have Eucharistic Adoration on Tuesday mornings following Mass until about 11:30AM.

CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony Proverbs 9: 1-6; Psalm 34: 2-7; Ephesians 5: 15-20; John 6: 51-58

What is it that we seek? To paraphrase Saint Augustine, we are all restless until we rest in God. We all were created to enjoy the good things of this world properly, appropriately, and thankfully. But such things never seem to be enough. What never fails is communion with God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit). The gift or grace of wisdom helps us to achieve that with the help of the Holy Spirit. Today's first reading portrays Wisdom as a force that sets out a banquet of food and drink for the soul. And Wisdom is available to all who seek truth, understanding, discernment, insight, good judgment, a rightly formed conscience, and all that is truly good. And Wisdom is available to all who forsake all foolishness, and all the vain and futile and fleeting pursuits of the ever-changing and dangerous world in which we live. In doing so we can be filled with the Holy Spirit and learn what is truly important, that is to learn and understand what the will of the Lord is for each of us. To do this we need to look to the LORD, the creator and provider of all that is good to be radiant with true joy. And to be freed from the fears and anxieties that hold us back.

Saint Paul tells us that we must be wise in how we live. We should take every opportunity to imitate the Lord, to comfort and encourage others in their holy pursuits as they do their best to use the gifts that God gave them for the good of all. WE must read scripture to forsake whatever ignorance there is in and among us. Thank the Lord for everything. It is not easy. We nourish ourselves with bread and celebrate at times, in moderation, with wine. To paraphrase Saint Augustine, the gains of wheat needed to be crushed, watered, and be subjected to fire to become loaves; and the grapes needed to be crushed to produce the wine. I do not believe in coincidence, so I declare to you that it is no coincidence that Christ chose bread and wine to be the host of his entire being (body and blood, soul and divinity) as He would be crushed for our sake and the sake of all humanity! This is His way to remain with us physically in this world, and to nourish us with the Bread of Eternal Life. In doing this, as Christ is in the Father, and the Father is in Him, in the Eucharist we are nourished, and we are in Christ and He in us. Thus, we are in Communion with Him as He is with the Father. What a gift! Cherish it and live it!!
