

<u>CROSS ROADS</u> By Deacon Tony Joshua 24: 1-2, 15-18; Psalm 34: 2-3, 16-21; Ephesians 5: 21-32; John 6: 60-69


I think that at some point in our lives we each have a personal moment of truth, a moment where circumstances and sometimes a person or persons challenge us to make a choice, perhaps a choice that can be life changing for good or for ill: to love or not to love, to give or to be selfish, to pay attention or to ignore, to believe or not to believe, choices which can affect our lives on this earth and in eternity. I think that such moments are what today's readings are about. In the first reading, Joshua challenges the tribes of Israel to decide **Now** as to whether they will keep their covenant with the LORD and serve Him, or serve the false gods of the Amorites, into whose land the Israelites had entered. The people decided to serve the LORD who delivered them from their slavery in Egypt, and who guided and protected them in their long and arduous journey.

In today's gospel, Jesus continues his discourse on the Eucharistic Mystery, a challenge to many of the disciples who could not comprehend it, for nobody can come to Christ unless granted by the Father; that is, unless they receive and accept the gift of faith. Jesus boldly declared that whoever does not eat HIS flesh and drink HIS blood cannot have life within them. Jesus (Jeshua in Hebrew) **IS** the new Joshua and the new covenant to be sealed by HIS Sacrifice of Himself for all. It would depend on faith and many disciples left Him. When Jesus asked the Twelve whether they too would leave, it was their moment of truth. Peter spoke for them all: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to **believe** and are convinced that **You are** The Holy One of God."

We too are challenged in our faith to persevere amid the sick and corrupt ideologies of this world and to some degree in our own country. The Lord did not destroy the Red Sea, but he did carve a path through it for the Israelites. We have challenges in this country, in the world and even in our families. The path carved out for us through our troubled waters is **faith and the Church.** Our families are a microcosm of the Church in a world trying to destroy the traditional family and the Church. Saint Paul suggests that families are called to love, respect, protect, cherish, heed one another, as Christ does for His Church! Challenges and difficulties abound. We must nourish our souls with the Bread and Blood of Eternal Life to persevere and to live in FAITH. The LORD hears us and is with us always!
