

CROSS ROADS

Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8; Psalm 15: 2-5; James 1:17-18, 21-22, 27; Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

How do we know what is good and pleasing to the LORD? The LORD gave us the answer to that question when he gave us his commands through Moses. Those commands are the spiritual GPS leading us on our journey to eternal life with him. They are clear and precise commands, not mere suggestions. They are not subject to individual interpretation. As the LORD said to Moses "you shall not add to what I command you nor subtract from it. Observe them carefully..." When we conform ourselves to those commands, to the LORD'S will and his ways, we are protected from casuistry and sophistry, that is, the false reasoning and fallacies of what is largely an amoral world. Consequently, we are called to obey by taking the LORD's commands to heart and living those commands, to be righteous, blameless, just, truthful, and kind toward each other.

The law of Moses, handed down from the LORD is the word of God. And the Word of God was made flesh in the person of Jesus Christ. In fact, Christ IS the law of Moses! Today's gospel emphasizes this in Christ's debate with the Pharisees and scribes who put man-made traditions and precepts before the LORD's: "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me." When we do not take the LORD's commands to heart and in how we live, evil begins in the depth of our hearts, and in our concupiscence, our thoughts turn to things like unchastity, adultery, greed, malice and on and on; perhaps the most grievous being the killing of the unborn, the most innocent of human life.

Who are today's Pharisees and scribes? Most conspicuous to me are those who value government and human desires over morality, those who claim to be devout Catholics but do not respect life and who conspicuously and unrepentantly reject what the Church teaches regarding faith and morals. Individuals and entire societies need a change of heart. That cannot happen unless we take the LORD's commands to heart, turn to the LORD in prayer, and humbly ask that He send the Holy Spirit to help us to conform to the LORD'S will and the LORD'S ways, the only path to holiness, joy, peace, and eternal life with God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit!


