

#### CROSS ROADS

Genesis 2: 18-24; Psalm128: 1-6; Hebrews 2: 9-11; Mark 10: 2-16

The Church teaches that "Conjugal love lived in fidelity to God's original plan is to be one of the principal manifestations of the kingdom proclaimed by Jesus." Genesis tells us: "That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one flesh." Also, Genesis tells us that after creating the man, Adam, God saw that it was not right for the man to be alone. God created every manner of other animals which Adam named, but none were fit to be a partner. So, God created the woman, Eve, out of Adam's rib, so that while different, they were intimately related, and they were compatible, because their differences as individuals complimented one another, that human life might go on through them, and that they might be given a share in the process of creation.

Today's psalm proclaims that the man who fears the Lord (that is, has an overwhelming awestruck respect for the Lord) would be blessed with a family like a wonderous human garden. But as we know, there was the FALL, which would require a Savior, and the sacrificial love of God among us in the person of Jesus Christ, the suffering servant who, in his divinity and humanity suffered along with humanity for humanity's redemption. Conjugal love is meant to emulate the sacrificial love demonstrated by the Christ, to put the needs of the beloved before oneself. Through Christ's sacrifice, humanity was given another chance to carry out God's original plan, but this time as brothers and sisters of Christ through our baptisms, and as children of the same Father.

In much of today's chaotic world, the values mentioned above are considered foolish. Individuality rather than sacramental and sacrificial union seems to rule; but it will never conquer God's original plan. But how do we live as righteous, upright couples and parents, in such an upside-down world? We do so by praying, especially praying together, by doing our best to live as God expects of us to live, and by realizing that even as couples we cannot do it alone. In our relatively flawed human ways, we can only do our best and let God help with the results. Patience with ourselves and with each other is essential. When we fall short, pray! Get back up! Ask, and The Lord will help!!


