# St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative Are Pro-life State Laws Preventing Pregnant Women from Receiving Emergency Care?

"A flurry of news articles and reports from pro-abortion medical organizations highlighting poor quality medical care in pro-life states have raised concerns that state laws may be preventing pregnant women from obtaining necessary care in medical emergencies...While it is not always easy to determine from a news article whether medical malpractice occurred, pro-life state laws are clear: doctors can intervene in medical emergencies."

- "All pro-life state laws allow doctors to exercise their medical judgment to treat women with pregnancy emergencies.
- Every state with a strong pro-life law permits doctors to treat women suffering from spontaneous miscarriages or ectopic pregnancies, and the treatment of these conditions is not considered an abortion under any law.
- Doctors and hospitals who fail to provide patients with necessary treatment in emergency circumstances may be committing malpractice."

### CROSS ROADS

Wisdom 7: 7-11; Psalm 90: 12-17; Hebrews 4: 12-13; Mark 10: 17-30

In today's reading from the Book of Wisdom, and in today's psalm, wisdom of heart and prudence were more important to Solomon than material possessions and riches like gold and silver. All such material riches are subject to corruption. Building treasure in heaven through our faith and good works are what we really need. In Paul's letter to the Hebrews, we learn that the word of God is "living and effective." and it can penetrate spirit and soul. Thus, the LORD knows us better than we know ourselves. We can run but we cannot hide. Wisdom and discernment help us to better understand the word of God, not just to make good decisions, but to discern, which is to understand what the LORD wants each of us to do.

In today's gospel, a well-meaning young man wants to know what he can do to inherit eternal life. Jesus reminded him of the commandments. The young man told Jesus that he has observed the commandments from his youth. Jesus then told the young man that what he should do now is to sell what he has and give to the poor to have treasure in heaven. As well-meaning as he was, contrary to what Solomon decided, the young man walked away sad because he had many possessions. Jesus responded and astonished his disciples by telling them how hard it is for the rich to enter the kingdom of God. But he added that nothing was impossible with God: a ray of hope.

It is not the riches that make it so difficult, it is the selfish attachment to material riches and possessions, and failure to share when one can that can cause the difficulty. But let us remember that riches are not limited to material wealth. God given talents are riches meant to be shared, as so many of you already do: such as music and art which enhance our experience of worship and can inspire and bestow peace. Knowledge of the faith can be used to help with religious education. Empathy can be used to help with what other people are suffering. Time and leadership can be used to protect life and can help with providing for the poor and the hungry. Acknowledging and encouraging other people in their efforts can help to bestow hope and confidence. In other words, seek the riches that are bestowed from above and share them with other people. And beware of being too interested in, and holding on too tightly to the material possessions offered by this world. Finally, I am reminded of something an old priest friend of mine used to say: "Live more simply so that others can simply live."
