There will be a holy hour of Divine Mercy **every Monday** from **6:30-7:30PM** in the lower church. All are welcome.


First Saturday Devotion

PURGATORY—THERE AND BACK AGAIN

What is Purgatory?

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of Heaven.

The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned.

-- Catechism of the Catholic Church 1030, 1031

How do we know Purgatory exists?

The existence of Purgatory follows two facts; our imperfection on earth and our perfection in Heaven. Rev. 21:27, Mt 5:8

"I would go so far as to say that if there was no Purgatory, then one would have to invent it, for who would dare say of himself that he was able to stand directly before God?"

Who are the Holy Souls in Purgatory?

Most of us who die in the grace of God as His friends, but still imperfect and require a "purification" before entering Heaven. These Holy Souls want to go to Purgatory for that purification. They are called holy because they are not yet perfect, they are on the way to Heaven.

Why do the Holy Souls need our Help?

The Church teaches that the Holy Souls in Purgatory cannot help or pray for themselves. Only the prayers, sacrifices and sufferings of the living can bring relief and consolation in attaining their eternal reward.

What can we do to help the Holy Souls?

The best way to help our brothers and sisters in Purgatory is to have the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered up for them or devoutly assist at Holy Mass for their relief or release. Make the stations of the cross for their consolation. Pray the rosary, the chaplet of Divine Mercy. By gaining indulgences (c.c.c. 1471-1479). Offering up our pain, self-denials, and suffering. Eucharistic adoration, offer up works or mercy, almsgiving and fasting.

St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative "In a national study over 60% of women who had abortions

"In a national study over 60% of women who had abortions report high level of external pressure to abort from one or more sources, and those same women report higher levels of subsequent mental health and quality of life issues, according to a new Lozier Institute peer-reviewed study published in the *Cureus* medical journal.

David Reardon, Ph.D. lead author of the study published in Feb. 2023, points out: "Abortion clinics cannot claim to be pro-woman while at the same time allowing the majority of their clients to be pressured into unwanted abortions...In a country torn by political debate over abortion, surely these findings underscore one point on which we should all be able to agree. No woman should ever feel pressured into accepting an unwanted abortion. Clearly, abortion clinics need to provide better pre-abortion screening and counseling..." The full study is accessible via the peer-reviewed library at Lozierinstitute.org.

CROSS ROADS

Jeremiah 31: 7-9; Psalm 126: 1-6; Hebrews 5: 1-6; Mark 10: 46-52

Today's first reading from Jeremiah, and today's psalm proclaim the restoration of Israel, the release of the remnants of its people from captivity, and their return to their land. That restoration would be fulfilled in the person of Jesus Christ who freed the remnant of Israel and all humanity from captivity to sin. **HE** is our guide, and our consolation. In his letter to the Hebrews, Saint Paul proclaims Jesus to be our High Priest, the Christ, the anointed one of God. Christ remains so to this day in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the Eucharist. He remains our guide through the Holy Gospels, and in the Sacrament of Penance. When we turn to Him, and when we call Him, He always hears us and blesses us with what we want and need, even though we may not always fully grasp what we need and want at our deepest levels.

In today's Gospel from Mark, Jesus and his disciples were leaving Jericho and were being followed by a sizable crowd. Bartimaeus, a blind man was sitting by the roadside. When he heard that it was Jesus passing by, he repeatedly shouted, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and told followers to call Bartimaeus to him. Some in the crowd would bring Bartimaeus to Jesus saying, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you. Bartimaeus went to Jesus. And Jesus asked a question, "What do you want me to do for you?" "Master, I want to see." One commentator suggests that Bartimaeus wanted to see more than his surroundings: he wanted to see reality and truth. Bartimaeus had never seen Jesus; and how did he know to call Jesus "Son of David?" Christ's reply was, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Bartimaeus immediately could see, not only his surroundings, but the face of the Anointed One of God. Bartimaeus' way would be to follow Jesus. The ORDO states that this miracle "witnesses to the inauguration of the kingdom."

What is **our** answer to Christ's question? Sometimes we can be blinded by the worries and distractions of this world; and even by our own willfulness to seek consolation elsewhere. The answer is imbedded in a quote from Saint Augustine of Hippo: "Because God has made us for Himself, our hearts are restless until they rest in HIM." Let us ask to **SEE** and **FOLLOW** the way to **HIM**. And let us all **help each other to see and to follow!**


