Eucharist adoration. Offer up works of mercy, almsgiving and fasting.

CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony Daniel 7: 13-14; Psalm 93: 1, 1-2, 5, Revelation: 5-8: John 18: 33-37

Today we celebrate Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the universe. Last week we were learning about the end times. In a sense, today we are learning about the beginning and the end: Jesus Christ is the Alpha and Omega (the beginning and the end). It is He who is our destination, not this earth. Paraphrasing a part of the first chapter of John's gospel: in the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God, and everything was created through Him and for Him.

I stumbled across a random commentary which suggests that when God created the universe, God spoke to the heavens. And when God created fish, God spoke to the waters and seas. And when God created trees, and all types of vegetation, God spoke to the earth and its soil. But when God created humanity, God spoke to Himself, Father Son and Holy Spirit: "Let us create man, and fashion him in our own image and likeness." Reflecting on this, it is clear from any perspective that in the vast cosmic expanse of creation, we are the only creation made in the image and likeness of God; and we were created with and for the Word of God made flesh, Jesus Christ, King of the universe, whose dominion is firm and lasts forever! In the words of the commentator, "God is our natural habitat." In other words, we were created to live with Him, we in Him and He in us; a gift and a destination not to be squandered.

When any living creation is separated from its natural habit, eventually it dies, fish out of water, trees and other vegetation out of the soil, and we when we leave God, His commandments, His trustworthy and essential precepts, and His sacrificial love as lived by the Word Made Flesh, we endanger our own spiritual lives. As we advance toward Advent, let us strive to live more fully in our natural habitat, with and for a loving God who is always there for us, and who came to save humanity amid the vastness of all creation.
