
Today begins the new liturgical year (year C); and it is the first Sunday of Advent. As I have said in the past, Advent is meant to be a time of solemn, patient, and hopeful expectation. Even amid the noise of our culture, and the tribulations of our current world, we must not let those things interfere with this time of preparation. We are preparing to be ready to allow our Savior to be reborn in our hearts and souls. Such preparation requires faith, patient waiting, and a commitment to open the door and make room for Him in the "Inn" of our hearts and souls, and a willingness to allow the Lord to help us conform to His will and His ways. It is a time to rejoice in the LORD's making good on his promise to send the Messiah: God with us in the person of Jesus Christ.

Let us be vigilant, but rejoice in loving one another as He loves us, and allow him to be reborn within us, as we live and worship through this beautiful time of year.
