St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception Affirms the Gospel of Life

Catholic doctrine infallibly proclaims that "the Blessed Virgin Mary, at the first instant of her conception...was preserved from all stain of original sin..." In a meditation on the Immaculate Conception, Fr. Donald Calloway suggests, "All of us are called to 'honor your mother and your father' according to the Ten Commandments. The Son of God honored his earthly mother by pouring His grace into her heart from the first moment of her life." In the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, the Church implicitly affirms that life begins at the very moment of conception and that from the start the child in the womb is a distinct person from his mother and endowed with a soul created by God. Our Lady's conception without sin is an utterly unique and unrepeatable mercy, but every human being shares from conception the dignity of a calling to mission as a Child of God for whom Jesus Christ became man and gave his life.

CROSS ROADS

Baruch 5:1-9; Psalm 126:1-6; Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11; Luke 3:1-6

In today's first reading, God did great things for the people of Israel when he led them out of captivity and slavery in foreign lands and brought them back to Jerusalem. And God did great things for all of us when he came to us in the person of Jesus Christ, Emanuel (God with us). Today is the second Sunday of Advent, a time of patient preparation for Jesus to be born again spiritually within our hearts and souls. It is a time to let go of distractions, anxieties, and fears that seem to plague the whole world in our present times. It is a time to make straight the way of the Lord, and at the same time to straighten out our own long and winding roads. Today's psalm reminds us that the Lord can do great things for each of us when we open our hearts and souls to him. He can take us out of our captivity to the distractions of this world. He can make the fears, anxieties, the mourning, and sadness that we may be suffering, and give us hope that he, and only he, can turn those things into laughter and rejoicing. The only question is are we willing to open wide our hearts and souls to him?

He gives us everything we need in the Eucharist and Confession. But as Saint Augustine wrote: "God provides the wind, but man must raise the sail." Saint Paul reminds us in today's second reading that when we cultivate love, good works, justice, a correct discernment of what is right and what is wrong, and we are blameless, we have a better sense of what is of true value, and we can pass it on to each other. Let us open wide our hearts and souls to the Lord. Let us prepare to be a spiritual resting place for the Lord this Christmas. Let us be examples of faith, hope, love, forgiveness, patience, righteousness, justice, and encouragement. In so doing we too can have a role like John the Baptist to make straight the way of the Lord, for ourselves and for others.
