#### CROSS ROADS

Zephaniah 3: 118; Isaiah 12: 2-6; Philippians 4:4-7; Luke3: 10-16

Today is Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete in Latin means rejoice. And that is the basic theme of today's readings. The first reading exhorts us to shout for joy, to be glad and exult with all our hearts, because the LORD is in our midst. That is applicable to this day, because the Lord is still with His people in the new Jerusalem, the Church. As we patiently wait for Christmas, we accept the truth that the Lord is with us in Spirit and in the flesh in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and the Eucharist. When we sing joyfully to the LORD in thanksgiving for His incarnation and sacrifice, the LORD rejoices over us and renews us in His love and showers us with the gift of the Sacraments.

Saint Paul goes further. He challenges us twice to rejoice in the Lord always, to pray in thanksgiving, to share our requests and petitions with the LORD, to let go of our sorrows, anxieties and fears by handing them over to the Lord and joining such things with the LORD'S sacrifice. As Isaiah suggests, be not afraid because the LORD is our strength and courage. In today's gospel we heard about John baptizing with water. He baptized repentant people, including the poor, tax collectors, and soldiers. Many speculated about whether John was the promised messiah. But John told them the truth that there was another coming, much greater than John, and who would baptize with the Holy Spirit. The people wanted to know what they should do. John gave advice that was particular to each of them, but applicable to all including us. Be fair and just, be truthful, in essence to spread the good news in word and in how we live.

In this season of gift giving and rejoicing, as we anticipate Christmas and our celebration of God with us in the person of Jesus Christ, let us avoid excesses. Let us remember that rejoicing, especially this time of year is in appreciation of God's gifts of His son, truth and sacraments, and passing them along to others in love, peace, and harmony. Let us live as we should. Saint Augustine wrote, "A Christian is: a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks, and a hand through which Christ helps." To paraphrase another writing of his: The greatest kindness one can render to a person is leading him or her to the truth.
