


#### CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony Isaiah 60: 1-6; Psalm 72: 1-2,7-8,10-13; Ephesians 3: 2-3, 5-6; Matthew 2: 1-12

Today we celebrate THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD (God revealing himself in a manner that humanity had not seen before). God humbled himself to become one of us, and to live among us as fully human and fully divine. He did so as a humble, vulnerable infant, dependent on the care and nurturing of human parents. He came to be the savior of all humanity, to bring inner peace, justice, healing and eternal life to all, including the poor, the afflicted, the lowly and helpless. The visit of the Magi and the gifts they would bring was foretold in today's reading from Isaiah. The Magi are a symbol of the inclusion of the Gentiles. Saint Paul's letter to the Ephesians states that Jews and Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promises of Christ.

Are we willing and equipped to proclaim the good news of salvation to help spread it to the ends of the earth? King Herod was not! In fact, King Herod was ignorant of the true meaning of the coming of the Messiah. A selfish, power hungry, paranoid, and worldly man, Herod, hearing of the birth of the Messiah from the Magi, was "greatly troubled." He had to ask the priests and scribes about the Messiah, and where he would be born. His intent was to kill anyone who he thought threatened his reign, and that of his lineage (power based on brute force), while the power of Jesus Christ was based on love, humility, service, sacrifice, and doing the will of the Father. In his ignorance and fear of losing power. Herod cast an early shadow of the Cross over the Christ child, a sign of things to come. Unlike Herod let us give ourselves as a gift to the Christ child by taking time to pray and to read the gospels regularly, by helping and encouraging each other, and by living a holy and informed life. Let us conform ourselves to the Lord's ways, not those of the world.
