Third Thursday Holy Hour for Priests Thursday, January 16



Jubilee Year of 2025 "Pilarims of Hope"

As some know and many don't, every 25 years the Holy Church has a Jubilee Year, a special year of grace and reconciliation, for the spiritual welfare of the faithful. This is such a year and the Vatican-selected theme is: Pilgrims of Hope.

The concept of jubilee years is rooted in Sacred Scripture. the book of Leviticus, chapter 25, therein, it is to occur every 50 years. The Church appropriated this concept in the 13th century under Pope Boniface VIII. Jubilee years are also called, "Holy Years." At first, they were celebrated every 100 years, then every 50 years, and now, since Pope St. John Paul II, every 25 years.

The tradition is chiefly connected with a pilgrimage to a specific church or shrine. A key symbol is a holy door, which calls to mind our Lord's words in St. John's Gospel (10:9): "I am the door. By me, if anyone enter in, he shall be saved, and he shall go in and go out, and shall find pasture."

Archbishop Richard Henning, has designated the Cathedral of the Holy Cross as a pilgrimage site, as well as the Xaverian Shrine in Holliston and the Immaculate Conception Church in Marlboro, in the West Region.

A Holy Year is an exceptionally good time to obtain indulgences, which are granted to the faithful, who: visit a pilgrimage site; go to confession within 20 days, before or after the visit; receive Holy Communion on that day; are free from the attachment of sin; and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father (an Our Father, Hail Mary & Glory Be).

An indulgence is "the remission in the sight of God of the temporal punishment due to sins, the guilt of which has already been forgiven" (Canon 922). Indulgences can be applied to: one's own soul; the holy souls in purgatory, in general; or for a specific soul in purgatory.

CROSS ROADS



Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7; Psalm 29:1-4, 9-10; Acts 10:34-38; Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

There is much to absorb in the readings listed above, and the various options which you see in the Pew Missile. Yet they seem to coalesce into one message. God came to live among us in the person of Jesus Christ. Last week we celebrated the Epiphany, the revelation of God with us, not just for Israel but as the King of Kings and Lord and Savior of all humanity. Today we celebrate the baptism of Jesus. Yet Jesus is sinless and not in need of forgiveness. But He became an example to all; and more than that, the Baptism of Jesus was more of an anointing, and another grand revelation of the nature of God.

In one place and in one Baptism, God was revealed Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Jesus was anointed with the Holy Spirit as the Christ, the anointed one of God. At the same time God made himself visible to those who were open to see Him, and vocal to those who were open to hear Him. God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit were revealed: the Father in His voice when He said to Jesus, "you are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased," Jesus revealed as the Son of God, and the Holy Spirit who descended upon Jesus in the form of a dove: all a revelation of the nature of the one God, who came to live among us for our salvation not because we deserved it, but because of God's tireless mercy and love. Jesus, the light of the world, makes salvation available to all who are willing to see and hear the message and the revelation, and to accept the Holy Spirit into their own hearts and souls. In this way God renews each of us and renews the face of the earth.

Also, there is an unspoken challenge to all of us to follow the example of Jesus Christ, the Anointed One of God. He lived in the Spirit and was filled with the Holy Spirit. Jesus lived, died, and rose again in the Holy Spirit. How can we know whether we are living in the Spirit. We can know only if we live, speak, and act in a way that demonstrates the Fruits of the Holy Spirit, as Jesus did: with love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, and self-control. That is how we are renewed, how we move toward Christ (the light of the world); and how we can assist in the renewal of the world.


