

#### CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony Nehemiah 8:2-6, 8-10; Psalm 19:8-10, 15; 1Corinthians 12:12-30; Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21


Today's readings give us insight into the value of God's laws and precepts, and into who God is in the person of Jesus Christ. In the first reading, Ezra reads a scroll of Holy Scripture of the laws of the Lord from daybreak to midday to the assembly of the people. He interpreted it for the people so that they would better understand; and the people listened intently. Both Ezra and Nehemiah proclaimed that day as holy to the Lord (the Sabbath). Some of the people cried as they listened. The context of this event was that the people had been released by Cyrus the Great from fifty years of their Babylonian captivity. Their return was both joyous and sad as they returned to Jerusalem, a city in ruins, and where the temple of Solomon had been destroyed. Some cried when Holy Scripture was read. They were encouraged to look up to glorify and rejoice in the LORD for their strength.

Today's psalm reminds us that God's laws and precepts are perfect, trustworthy. They impart wisdom. They are clear and enlightening. They are true and they inspire awe, reverence and respect for the power and authority of the LORD. In today's gospel, Jesus returns to Nazareth where he grew up and went to the synagogue on the Sabbath. He chose a scroll of Isaiah. Jesus was full of the Spirit, and he read and spoke with authority. The passage spoke of being anointed and sent to bring good tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, recovery of sight to the blind, the oppressed going free and a year acceptable to the Lord. That passage is a reference to the Messiah. Then Jesus proclaimed that the passage had been fulfilled in their hearing. To those present that could only mean one thing: that Jesus was proclaiming that he is the Messiah. It was not well received by people. To them it was considered blasphemy. They had no faith. That day, their spiritual blindness persisted. And they would not be set free from their captivity to their own sinfulness and clinging to their own false ways and expectations.

In our own times there are many obstacles to seeing the way, the truth and the life in the person of Jesus Christ. The new Jerusalem is the Church, the Mystical Body of Christ of which each of us is an essential part, with our own unique gifts, talents, and roles bestowed on each of us by the Lord to carry on His work. Nevertheless, the obstacles, and opposition to the truth and to Faith in this dangerous and secular world can be daunting. As did the children of Israel upon their return from captivity, look up to glorify and rejoice in the LORD. He will give us what we need to be strong for him and for each other.
