

CROSS ROADS

Isaiah 6:1-8; Psalm 138:1-5,7-8; 1 Corinthians 15:1-11; Luke: 5:1-11

In today's readings we hear words of humility, selfdoubt, and finally commitment from three of the most famous, productive, and noteworthy of biblical characters: Isaiah, Saint Paul, and Simon Peter. In the first reading, Isaiah experiences a vision of Heaven, including "the Lord seated on high" and angels (Seraphim) stationed above and crying out "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts." It was a frightening experience for Isaiah, who thought he was doomed because he thought of himself as "...a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips," an unworthy man who had seen the Lord. But one of the seraphim flew to Isaiah and purified him with an ember from the altar, thus removing Isaiah's wickedness, and purging Isaiah's sin. Then the Lord said, "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" Isaiah answered the call, saying "Hear I am... send me!

In 1 Corinthians, Saint Paul proclaims that he is the least of the apostles because he had persecuted the Church. Yet he acknowledges that by the grace of God he had been productive in preaching the gospel of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. In Luke's gospel Jesus preached from Simon Peter's boat. When he was finished, Jesus told Simon Peter to go out to deeper water for a catch. At first Simon Peter objected because he and his partners had been fishing all night and caught nothing. Nevertheless, Simon Peter obeyed Jesus, went out to deeper water, cast the nets and suddenly was inundated with more fish than he and his crew could handle, and he had to call for help from the boat of his partners. Back on shore, Simon Peter fell to his knees before Jesus saying, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Jesus told Simon Peter "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." Simon Peter along with James and John, answering the call, immediately left everything to follow Jesus.

Humanity, though made in the image and likeness of God, in our brokenness, can be a complicated lot. Sometimes we think too much of ourselves, and sometimes we can think too little of ourselves in our self-doubt. Sometimes we forget we can do nothing worthwhile without the grace of God. We can forget that the Lord sees our potential and knows us better than we know ourselves. It is the Lord who grants us strength from within. We all are unworthy, yet all are called to help continue the mission of Jesus Christ. Do not be afraid! Look up, praise the Lord, and say "here I am, send me." As St. Augustine wrote, "There is no saint without a past, no sinner without a future."
