# St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative Survivor of Abortion Addresses March for Life Rally, January 24, 2025

On behalf of the Abortion Survivor's Network, Josiah Presley, age 29, addressed tens of thousands at the March for Life Rally, Jan. 24th, 2025. Ethnically South Korean, Josiah is the survivor of a failed abortion at two months. Several months after the attempt to abort, his birth mother, realizing that her unborn baby was alive, carried him to term. Adopted from South Korea by an American family, Josiah, with one arm deformed by his failed abortion, was raised in the United States. This is how Josiah began his speech. "This journey has been a long journey. This journey has been a difficult journey, but this is the journey that God has placed on my life. And today I march to be a voice for those who are voiceless, like I was all those years ago. I march because when I was unseen and devalued, my God had a different plan, and today we march to declare what our creator has already declared: that all human life is valuable because it is created in the image of God." #### CROSS ROADS

1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23;
Psalm 103:1-4, 8, 10, 12-13
1 Corinthians 15:45-49; Luke 6:27-38

In today's reading from Samuel, King Saul along with three thousand men, was hunting his son, David. At night, David and Abishai were able to sneak into Saul's encampment where Saul and his army were sleeping. They found Saul with his spear close at hand. It was as if Saul had been delivered to David by the LORD. Abishai volunteered to kill King Saul. David said, "Do not harm him, for who can lay hands on the LORD's anointed and remain unpunished." Further into the reading, David declares, "Only the LORD can strike him; either when the time comes for him to die, or when he goes out and perishes in battle." At a distant hilltop David shouted that he had Saul's spear and asked Saul to send an attendant to retrieve it, saying, "I would not harm the Lord's anointed."

The LORD's patience, kindness, and compassion are boundless, and available to those who are in awe of his power and mercy. He puts our transgressions far behind us. Saint Paul reminds us that Adam, the first man, was earthly. But Christ is the heavenly man. We bear the image of the earthly Adam because we are earthly; but through our Baptism, and by the grace of God, we also bear the image of Christ, the Heavenly Man.

Christ is God among us who we are to reflect. In today's gospel, he commands us to love our enemies, to bless those who curse us, to pray for those who mistreat us, to lend without expecting a return, to give to everyone. He commands us not to judge, that we might not be judged. In the end, we will be treated by the same measure we have treated others. I invite you to find the abovementioned reading from Samuel in your bible, and to read all through it. In the touching dialogue between David and Saul, Saul admits that he was wrong, and invited David, to come home. It demonstrates that by the grace of God, love, forgiveness, mercy, and praying for those who mistreat us can be very disarming to both the forgiver and the aggressor. Recall, Christ forgave from the cross, and he taught us to pray, "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."


