Jubilee Year of 2025 "Pilgrims of Hope"

As some know and many don't, every 25 years the Holy Church has a Jubilee Year, a special year of grace and reconciliation, for the spiritual welfare of the faithful. This is such a year and the Vatican-selected theme is: Pilgrims of Hope.

The concept of jubilee years is rooted in Sacred Scripture, the book of Leviticus, chapter 25, therein, it is to occur every 50 years. The Church appropriated this concept in the 13th century under Pope Boniface VIII. Jubilee years are also called, "Holy Years." At first, they were celebrated every 100 years, then every 50 years, and now, since Pope St. John Paul II, every 25 years.

The tradition is chiefly connected with a pilgrimage to a specific church or shrine. A key symbol is a holy door, which calls to mind our Lord's words in St. John's Gospel (10:9): "I am the door. By me, if anyone enter in, he shall be saved, and he shall go in and go out, and shall find pasture."

Archbishop Richard Henning, has designated the Cathedral of the Holy Cross as a pilgrimage site, as well as the Xaverian Shrine in Holliston and the Immaculate Conception Church in Marlboro, in the West Region.

A Holy Year is an exceptionally good time to obtain indulgences, which are granted to the faithful, who: visit a pilgrimage site; go to confession within 20 days, before or after the visit; receive Holy Communion on that day; are free from the attachment of sin; and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father (an Our Father, Hail Mary & Glory Be).

An indulgence is "the remission in the sight of God of the temporal punishment due to sins, the guilt of which has already been forgiven" (Canon 922). Indulgences can be applied to: one's own soul; the holy souls in purgatory, in general; or for a specific soul in purgatory.

St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative "Botched Care and Tired Staff: Planned Parenthood in Crisis" [NYT Feb.15th]

"The New York Times published a report detailing a multifaceted crisis confronted by Planned Parenthood state affiliates, which appear to be grappling with tight resources, inadequate staff training, high employee turnover rates, and complaints of dismal clinic conditions at various locations." The NY Times article entitled, "Botched Care and Tired Staff: Planned Parenthood in Crisis," reports that "the Times reviewed legal filings, clinic documents, and interviews with over 50 Planned Parenthood current and former employees". The article explained, "Over the last five years, the national office has distributed more than \$899 million to affiliates to help them deliver care, but none of it went directly to medical services." "Employees of Planned Parenthood have said there has been constant pressure to more than double the number of patients seen from the present 2.1 million, to help bring in more revenues." "Latest year end records indicate that Planned Parenthood aborted at least 392,715 unborn children between 2023-2024."

CROSS ROADS

Deuteronomy 26:4-10; Psalm 91:1-2, 10-15; Romans 10:8-13; Luke 4:1-13

Today's readings start with Moses portraying in Deuteronomy great events of salvation history to the people, a people who started out in small numbers as wanderers, who entered Egypt where they multiplied into a great nation of many. But they eventually were mistreated by the Egyptians and forced into hard labor. They cried out to the LORD who heard them and brought them out of Egypt to the promised land.

In today's psalm the LORD is referred to as "My refuge and fortress, my God in whom I trust...for to his angels he has given command about you, that they guard you in all your ways...Upon their hands they shall bear you up lest you dash your foot against a stone." "He shall call upon me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in distress; I will deliver him and glorify him." All of this is fulfilled in Jesus Christ. Saint Paul reminds us today that Jesus is Lord of all for God raised him from the dead, and there is no distinction between Jew and Greek.

In today's gospel, shortly after the Father proclaimed at the Jordan that Jesus was His Son, filled with the Spirit, Jesus was led to the desert where he would fast and pray for forty days, about his future and his mission willed by the Father. After the forty days Jesus was hungry, and he was tempted by the devil who knew who Jesus was, and who wanted to divert Jesus from his mission. He tempted Jesus to turn stones into bread. He tempted him with earthly kingdoms. He tempted him to demonstrate his divinity. In so doing we hear the devil, somewhat surprisingly quoting Scripture. Jesus' response to the temptations was "One does not live by bread alone...It is written you shall worship the Lord your God, and him alone shall you serve." When the devil challenged Jesus to throw himself off the parapet of the temple. Jesus' response was: "It also says, "You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." Jesus clearly knew his own identity. When we believe and proclaim in word and deed Jesus to be Lord of all, who died and was raised for our salvation, and trust in the love of the Father as Jesus did, we shall be saved! Lent is upon us. Now is our time in the desert to pray, contemplate our future and our individual missions. My adopted motto, and my suggestion is, "Encourage each other daily while it is still today." Hebrews 3: 13.


