#### CROSS ROADS

Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18; Psalm 27:1, 7-9, 13-14, Philippians 3:17-4:1; Luke 9:28-36

Today's readings and Lent are about God's love for humanity, faith in God and His promises, and on covenant (God keeping his promises to humanity, and we keeping our promises to God, that is, to love Him above all). Humanity has a long history of not keeping it's promises to God, going back to Eden, and even to this day. In the time of Abram, God decided to take the initiative, and to make a covenant with Abram and his descendants. God turned to Abram, a simple old, but faithful man. He was told what to do, and he made the sacrifice he was told to make. Enveloped by a dark cloud, the voice of the Lord was heard, "to your descendants I give this land, from the Wadi of Egypt to the Great River, the Euphrates." Humanity needed only to love God beyond all. But Abram's descendants kept that promise at times, but not at other times. To this day, humanity has a way of clinging to earthly distractions and letting the love of God slip out of their hands

But God decided to make a new and eternal covenant: He would live among us through His Christ, the second person of the Trinity, and be a living example and revelation of who God is and how much He loves us, and how much we should love each other. The message of Christ was misunderstood, that He would have to suffer, die and rise, and that to be saved we needed to let go of earthly distractions and pick up and carry our own crosses; and follow Him and His example. Even Christ's closest followers did not get it until after the passion and resurrection. They did not even get it at the Transfiguration. But they, especially Peter, learned a lesson about silence. At the Transfiguration, a dark cloud encompassed them (as it did with Abram), and before Peter could finish what he was saying, the Father spoke:" This is my chosen Son; Listen to Him."

Lent is a time to learn that lesson. If one wants to hear and listen to the Lord, one must practice silence. It is not a coincidence that the word "listen" contains the same letters as the word "silent." Saint Padre Pio is credited with saying that Lent is a time of surrender. We are to quiet our minds and take the time to be silent and listen. We listen not with our ears, but with our heart and soul, to discern what God is asking us to do. Let us pray, "Lord, let us be silent and listen, and may we be prompted to unconditionally surrender ourselves to You with faith and confidence that You will help and shape us to be more like You, and that we may let go of earthly distractions, take up our cross and follow you."


