

#### St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative

"Why So Many Young Men are Publicly Supporting the Pro-life Movement: Men are raising awareness that they can, and should, have a voice on abortion."

Tens of thousands participated in this year's March for Life. Among them were thousands of young men. Ryder Wittman, 20, a senior at Colorado Christian University, paused to be interviewed by The Epoch Times, "I think a lot of guys aren't even aware that they can be part of this [referring to the March]." He said his friends and peers have told him, "Oh, I didn't know I could have an opinion about that [abortion]. I didn't know there was anything I could do. I thought that was a female thing." Wittman said that while volunteering at a pregnancy center in Denver, he comes face to face with young men who feel voiceless over an unplanned pregnancy, even when their girlfriends want them to speak up. "A lot of guys come in and they're my age, you know, they're 19, 20, 21, and, you know, the mentality they're told is, 'I can't have an opinion on this...And their girlfriends, they'll be looking at them saying, 'Hey, lead me in this. Tell me what we should do.' So the big thing for me is how do we challenge that. How do we combat the idea that men don't have a say here. It's really heartbreaking and tragic to witness." # CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony

Exodus 3:1-8, 13-15, Psalm 103:1-4, 6-8, 11; 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12; Luke 13:1-9

The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob witnessed the suffering and affliction of His people in Egypt. Moses, captivated by the sight of a burning bush on Mount Horeb, had to take a closer look at the phenomenon of a fiery bush that was not being consumed by the fire. The Lord called to Moses and gave Moses the task to lead the Israelites out of their captivity and slavery in Egypt. When asked by Moses for the Lord's name, the Lord answered, "I Am Who Am...Tell them that I Am sent you", thus making the point that the Lord is the one who was, who is, and who always will be, and the reason for, and the author of, all creation. Moses did as he was told, but there would be problems.

There were many trials. The people did not always abide by the Lord's will and the Lord's way. They complained, grumbled, they doubted, and in a sense they became self-righteous. Righteousness is obedience to the Lord's will, and the Lord's way. Self- righteousness is based on a sense of privilege, and a sense of immunity from hard times. Self-righteousness can blind us to our own faults, be a source of self-inflicted sorrows, and obstruct our repentance. Hardships and trials are part of this world. We should realize that suffering can be a reminder that we should be praying, reading scripture, and turning to the Lord always, not just in the difficult times that we all face.

The parable of the fruitless fig tree in today's gospel demonstrates the Lord's mercy, but it also is a reminder that it is urgent that we all repent. When people mentioned the slaughter of Galileans by Pilate, and the eighteen people who were killed when the tower at Siloam fell on them, Jesus insisted that they were no more sinful than anyone else. Recall the saying that when the sun shines, it shines on the good and the bad; and when it rains, it also rains on the good and the bad. All must repent with a sense of urgency. If we turn to the Lord, He will give us what we need to endure. In his passion and death, Jesus surrendered himself to injustice and death for our sake and rose from the dead. When we surrender ourselves to HIM, His will and His ways, by the grace of God, we will do the same.


