

### The Veiling of Crosses and Statues

According to the Roman Missal, the practice of covering crosses and images in the church may be observed, beginning on the Saturday before the fifth Sunday of Lent. In 1988, the Sacred Congregation for Divine Worship, in Paschale Solemnitatis, encouraged the practice, though it is not mandatory. This practice was obligatory in the Church for centuries, up until 1970. Why does the Church encourage this practice? To heighten our Lenten awareness and sharpen our spiritual focus on the great mysteries of our faith that Holy Week makes present: the passion, death, and resurrection of our beloved Savior. In the words of the noted Benedictine liturgist Abbot Dom Gueranger, presentiment of that awful hour of our Savior's passion leads the afflicted mother, the Church, to veil the image of her Jesus: the cross is hidden from the eyes of the faithful. The statues of the saints, too, are covered; for it is but just that, if the glory of the Master be eclipsed, the servant should not appear."

Help Stop Physician Assisted Suicide: Make your voice heard!

In 2012, the voters of our Commonwealth rejected physician-assisted suicide in a state-wide referendum. In 2022, the Massachusetts Supreme Court refused to find a right to assisted suicide in our Constitution. Nevertheless, now, in 2025, the pro-suicide lobby is again pushing <a href="HB2505/SB1486">HB2505/SB1486</a>, "An Act relative to end of life options," to legalize assisted suicide in Massachusetts. We oppose this bill for these reasons: Physician-assisted suicide invites abuse and creates a slippery slope toward devaluing life. Devaluing life for some means devaluing life for all. Physician-assisted suicide is never necessary and always ends a unique and valuable human life. ### CROSS ROADS

By Deacon Tony Isaiah 43:16-21; Psalm 126:1-6; Philippians 3:8-14; John 8:1-11

In today's first reading, Isaiah predicts a new era, a new exodus for the Hebrews. This time it is their release from captivity in Babylon to freedom, an act of justice by the Lord. The newly freed Hebrews rejoiced and praised the Lord as we see in today's psalm. At times, we too may find ourselves in captivity, that is, captivity to sin. But when we have faith in Jesus, He will free us. Faith in Him is the key to freedom, righteousness, justice, and the way to eternal life with Him. When we fall, we should not allow ourselves to be discouraged. He knows our struggles and He gave us the sacrament of reconciliation. By His sacrifice, and the sacrament we are reconciled and given the grace to persevere.

Recall that Jesus carried His cross, and that He fell three times. Yet each time He persevered, got up, and carried His cross to His own crucifixion. When we fall in our struggles with sin, or we suffer because of hardships or illnesses, we too must get up, look up, and join our sorrows and pain with His; and persevere on our journey to eternity. As Christ got up, carried his cross to His crucifixion, death and resurrection, we too must persevere and have faith that He is with us, and that He gives us the grace we need to carry on, and to help others to do the same

Our challenge is to know Him and to try to know ourselves as He knows us. We look up to Him to help us to know our own strengths and weaknesses. Christ is the true example of righteousness, not the self-righteousness demonstrated by the Pharisees, who burdened and judged others without bearing their own burdens, and without acknowledging their own weaknesses and sinfulness, as we see in today's gospel. Their bringing the woman caught in the act of adultery to Jesus was not an act of true righteousness or justice. It was a ploy to trap Jesus, who saw right through them. There was no justice in what they did. For instance, who was the man who was with the woman caught in the act of adultery; and why was he not brought to Jesus? When none of the Pharisees could honestly throw the first stone, Jesus forgave the woman but commanded her to sin no more. The lesson for us is that we must know our own weaknesses and sinfulness, before we are too quick to accuse others; and we must remember that there can be no forgiveness without repentance.


