<u>Divine Mercy Sunday</u> THIS Sunday, April 27, 2025

On the Sunday after Easter, the entire Catholic Church is called to gather throughout the world to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This beautiful devotion led Pope John Paul II on April 30, 2000, on the occasion of the canonization of St. Faustina, to officially designate the Sunday after Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday in the Roman liturgical calendar. From Saint Faustina's diary, it is clear that this Octave Day of Easter is a day chosen by Christ as a day of extraordinary graces—a complete outpouring of His mercy upon all who approach Him with great trust and expectant faith. On April 22, 2001, one year after establishing Divine Mercy Sunday, Pope John Paul II re-emphasized its message quoting St. Faustina: "Jesus said to St. Faustina one day: 'Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy.' Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity." The words of Jesus to Saint Faustina: "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of my tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy. The souls that will go to confession and receive holy communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of my most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The feast of mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is my desire that it will be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the fount of My mercy."

Divine Mercy Sunday

The Sunday in the octave of Easter is Mercy Sunday established by Pope John Paul II, on April 30, in the Jubilee Year of 2000, and is to be observed by the universal Church. The schedule for Mercy Sunday, **THIS Sunday, April 27, 2025**, in the afternoon at St. John's will be as follows:

1:30 PM Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament followed by the rosary.

2:00 PM Confessions will be heard.

2:30 PM Readings from the diary of St. Faustina will be proclaimed.

3:00 PM The Divine Mercy Chaplet will be chanted.

3:30 PM Benediction and Final Blessing.

St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative

In her diary does St. Faustina speak about abortion?
The answer is yes!

"One day Jesus told me that He would cause a chastisement to fall upon the most beautiful city in our country. This chastisement would be that with which God had punished Sodom and Gomorrah. I saw the great wrath of God and a shudder pierced my heart. I prayed in silence. After a moment Jesus said to me, My child, unite yourself closely to Me during the Sacrifice and offer My Blood and My Wounds to My Father in expiation for the sins of that city. Repeat this without interruption throughout the entire Holy Mass. Do this for seven days. On the seventh day I saw Jesus in a bright cloud and began to beg Him to look upon the city and upon our whole country. Jesus looked [down] graciously. When I saw the kindness of Jesus, I began to beg His blessing. Immediately Jesus said, For your sake I bless the entire country. And He made a big sign of the cross over our country. Seeing the goodness of God, a great joy filled my soul." The Diary of St. Faustina entry 39. "Her confessor [Fr. Sopocko] later discovered that when St. Faustina wrote this, the city of Warsaw, capital of Poland, was one of the great capitals of abortion in the world! While Sister Faustina lived and prayed, that city was spared. But hardly a year after her death, Poland was invaded, and by the time the war was over. Warsaw was almost completely destroyed. "

CROSS ROADS

Acts 5:12-16; Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24; Revelation 1:9-13, 17-19; John 20:19-31

Today we continue to celebrate the resurrection of Christ. As the Second Sunday of Easter, today is also Sunday of Divine Mercy. We are drawn into the upper room where Christ's disciples hid, even though Jesus had been seen in the flesh by Mary of Magdala; and Peter and John had seen for themselves that Jesus was not in the tomb. On the evening of the day Christ rose from the dead, he entered the locked room, and the disciples saw Christ for themselves, and they witness an example of Christ's Divine and everlasting mercy. Keep in mind that these are the same disciples, most of whom abandoned Christ when he was arrested, tortured and crucified.

But instead of rebuking them, Jesus said, "Peace be with you" and Jesus showed them his wounds. The disciples rejoiced. Again, Jesus said, "Peace be with you" and he gave and trusted them with a mission: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Then Jesus breathed the Holy Spirit into them and gave them the authority and power to forgive and retain sins. Thomas was not with the other disciples that evening. When Thomas was told of the event, he pronounced that he would not believe until he saw Jesus and His wounds. A week later, when Thomas was present, Jesus entered the locked room again; and Thomas saw and heard for himself. He proclaimed, "My Lord and my God." This is when Jesus, who always has all of us in mind, brings us into the room and blesses all who have believed but have not seen.

We too, have not been rebuked by Christ; and we too have been given the Holy Spirit, and have been sent by him as he was sent by the Father. Mercy is a gift that we have been given again and again. We too are sent to spread the Word and His mercy. Though we do not have the authority to forgive or retain sins, we are commanded to be examples of mercy, to "forgive those who trespass against us." We too are sent as the Father has sent Christ, which inevitably includes suffering of some kind. It could even be persecution, ridicule or criticism because of our faith, or for standing strong for life. In these times, our world is a dangerous place for Christians. But as it is said in John's vision in Revelation: "Do not be afraid. I AM the first and the last, the one who lives...now and forever." Christ and His mercy are alive forever; and He is with us through all our hardships, difficulties, and sufferings! Let us pray: Lord, help us to live our Faith in all circumstances!


