# St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative "Groundbreaking" Chemical Abortion Study Reveals FDA Data Failure


## Marian-Inspired Mother-Daughter Tea

## CROSS ROADS

Acts 15: 1-2,22-29; Psalm 67:2-3, 5-6, 8: Revelation 21: 10-14, 22-23; John 14: 23-29

In today's readings we learn more about how important it is to be open and to listen to the Spirit promised by Jesus. We also learn how important it is to concentrate our prayers and efforts to love the Lord by keeping His word. In Acts, we see controversy in the early Church regarding whether Gentile converts needed to observe Jewish ritual practices, one of which is circumcision. There was a significant amount of dissension regarding the issue. Being open to the Spirit, and listening to the promptings of the Spirit, the apostles and elders in Jerusalem decided that apart from four of such practices, there were no other rituals that needed to be observed. It would be unnecessary to burden converts with ritual practices that might disturb their peace of mind, especially since the Lord wishes only to impart peace to all of us.

The Lord makes everything new! In Revelation there is a vision of the new Jerusalem descending from heaven: the new Jerusalem of the Church founded by Christ with the apostles at its core, and the apostolic traditions and apostolic succession through the centuries, the Mystical body of Christ, with Christ as its eternal light.

In today's Gospel, Jesus, as he prepares his apostles for His departure from this earth and His ascension to the Father, Jesus tells all of us what is important: to love Him by keeping His word. If we love Him in that way, the Father will love us. He urges them, if they love Him, to rejoice that He is going to the Father, but He also promises to return. He urges them not to be afraid, to accept His gift of the Spirit, and the peace that He bestows. I have read that in some ways He is closer to us now than if He were walking the earth. We have nothing to fear. We are never alone. He is with us because the Church is His Mystical Body. We can visit Him as He is present in the tabernacle. He can live within us because of His gift of the Eucharist. There are crosses to bear, but He helps us to carry them. Peace! Do not be afraid! Believe in His constant presence and availability! Seek what is above and invite Him to be part of all your endeavors!


