

Pope Leo Endorses the Family to International Diplomatic Corp

On May 16th in his first address as Pope to the worldwide diplomatic corp in which he was expected to lay out his position on international affairs, Pope Leo endorsed the traditional family: "It is the responsibility of government leaders to work to build harmonious and peaceful civil societies. This can be achieved above all by investing in the family, founded upon the stable union between a man and a woman, 'a small but genuine society, and prior to all civil society." In the same address, Pope Leo continued: "No one is exempted from striving to ensure respect for the dignity of every person, especially the most frail and vulnerable, from the unborn to the elderly, from the sick to the unemployed, from the citizen to the immigrant."

THE CONVERSION OF SINNERS AND THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF JESUS

The Precious Blood of Jesus was shed on the cross; by it Jesus won all the graces necessary for the salvation of every human being, from Adam to the last person that will be born. We simply need to grasp these graces and apply them to ourselves and others. The Precious Blood is a flowing fountain of spiritual gifts that will never run dry. St. John's has an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) on site! It is located in the lower Sacristy in the main church on the east wall in a white box. Should a cardiac event occur, the unit will walk you through the steps for use. Do you know where the closest exit is in the event of a fire? Did you know a fire pull box is located in the narthex north-side (left when leaving) and the lower Sacristy next to the AED? Additionally, we have multiple pull boxes and extinguishers in the Parish Center. Take a moment to look around.

CROSS ROADS

Deuteronomy 30:10-14; Psalm 19:8-11; Colossians 1:15-20; Luke 10:25-37

We are commanded to follow the law and precepts of the Lord. The law of the Lord is perfect, trustworthy, and wise. All the Lord's commands are clear and enlightening, true and just. His laws and precepts are more precious than anything the world has to offer. But we must remember that the Lord's commands are grounded in love, mercy, and compassion. As we know, Jesus is the image of the invisible God. Jesus IS "God-With-US". And God IS love. We were created to be in the image and likeness of the Lord our God. If we seek to follow the Lord, we must seek to follow His commands. Out of love, mercy, and compassion, Jesus reconciled us through the blood of his cross.

Today's gospel stresses "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." And our neighbors are humanity in general, especially the downtrodden, those who suffer, those who mourn, and those who are needy, poor, or afflicted. It must have been upsetting to the scholar of the law in today's gospel to have to admit that it was a Samaritan in the parable that Jesus used, who was the one who followed the law as it was intended to be followed, with love, compassion, and mercy. Jesus told the scholar to "Go and do likewise."

In his ministry, Jesus spent most his time teaching and tending to those who were needy, poor, afflicted, suffering, or in mourning. Reconciled by Christ, "we have been created in, for, and through Christ. To follow Him we are called to obey the command to love God with all our hearts, souls and efforts, and our neighbors as ourselves, with love, compassion and mercy as He did: to "go and do likewise." It is not easy; but in the words of Saint Paul: "Encourage each other daily, while it is still to-day." (Hebrews 3: 13).


