There will be a holy hour of Divine Mercy every Monday from 6:30-7:30PM in the lower church. All are welcome.


# Holy Hour for the Conversion of Sinners and Prayers for the Dying

## What does the church teach about Purgatory?

- 1. There is a Purgatory
- 2. The holy souls in Purgatory are in a state of grace; and are sure of their eternal salvation.
- 3. They suffer to satisfy the justice of God for past sin which has been forgiven but has not been sufficiently atoned for. Rev. 21:27; MT. 5:8
- 4. The souls in Purgatory cannot help themselves, only the faithful on earth can help to shorten their time of purification, especially by the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

# CROSS ROADS



Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23; Psalm 90:3-6,12-14,17; Colossians 3:1-5,9-11; Luke 12:13-21

In Ecclesiastes we hear and read the phrase, "vanity of vanities." In the context of the times and the message that was being stressed, vanity, especially vanity of vanities, means something different than we might initially think. To be more precise the message, especially when one reads all of today's readings, the word, vanity, refers to something done in vane, worthless, and futile! In the context of today's readings, the example is laboring only for earthly riches, possessions, and pleasures only for oneself, without regard or action to share, and helping the needy. That way of life can be very harmful to those who live that way, leading to hoarding, selfishness, corruption, anxiety out of fear of losing what one has worked for.

In the larger context, such a life is futile, because riches and possessions do not last, because all earthly things pass away. They may provide some pleasure, and they may not run out while one is alive on this earth; but all of us run out of time; and what will we say to the Lord when we see him face to face. As Saint Paul warns us today that a life lived in that manner can be a form of idolatry; worshiping the things of this world, instead of the Lord. Saint Paul not only summed up these things nicely in today's reading; but also in these words from Romans 8:18-21: "... for creation was made subject to futility, not of its own accord but because of the one who subjected it, in hope that creation itself be set free from slavery to corruption, and share in the in glorious freedom of the children of God."

What is the cure? None of this means that anyone should ignore the needs of one's family. But one should also take care of the larger scale of our business. The business of our lives is the business and needs of humanity in general. Look up. Seek first what is above and build up riches for eternity by gathering and living the riches of faith, hope, love, generosity, kindness, and empathy. Appreciate the things of this world; but do not be ruled by them or hold on to them so tightly. Every day, loosen that grip, lay them down, pick up your cross and follow Christ, and live according to his will and his ways.


