

Archbishop Critiques United Nation's Health Programs "On July 14, Archbishop Gabriele Caccia, the Vatican's permanent observer to the United Nations, issued a statement highlighting the inconsistent implementation of health and well-being programs, particularly those aimed at protecting the unborn. 'Achieving health and wellbeing for all also calls for special attention to be paid to the most vulnerable members of the human family, including the unborn, children, the elderly, persons with disabilities, migrants and those living in conflict-affected areas,' the archbishop stated. 'This is a right for all, not a privilege for the few, rooted in the fundamental truth that every human life is sacred and worthy of care from conception to natural death.'"

CROSS ROADS



Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10; Psalm 40:2-4, 18; Hebrews 12:1-4; Luke 12:49-53

Jeremiah preached the truth. It resulted in his being rejected and treated badly, all because he preached the truth about what is right and what is wrong. Those who were set in their ways, and did not want to change, conspired and set out to do away with him by throwing Jeremiah into a muddy cistern, where he would sink, and possibly die from starvation. But the Lord came to Jeremiah's aid. When the king was told by a court official what happened to Jeremiah, the king ordered the court official to take three men to rescue him.

Christ, the way, the truth, and the life came among us because of his loving concern for humanity, to tell the truth about what is right and what is wrong, to preach and heal the self-inflicted wounds of sin. But he too would be rejected by those who were set in their ways, who did not want to change or to lose their lofty status. Christ became their target for persecution, humiliation, and elimination to the point of death on the cross. Saint Paul tells us that Christ did this so that we might persevere. Christ died and rose from the dead in order that we not grow weary, lose heart, or abandon the struggle against sin. His death and resurrection lift us up from the cistern of sin and gives us a chance to persevere in the struggle. He came to set the world on fire with the truth, love, faith and confidence in the Lord who hears those who are persecuted and afflicted.

If we trust in the Lord and surrender ourselves to the Lord's will and the Lord's ways, the Lord will be with us. In our culture, anyone who takes the Holy Bible seriously, and stands for the truth, stands for morals, and stands for life, may suffer ridicule, being "canceled" (a modern type of social elimination). That can happen in public forums, in families, and among friends. We do not have the luxury of silence when we are in the face of evil. Those who are silent for the sake of peace in the family and among friends are not doing themselves or others any good. Over time, silence in the face of evil can lead one to become a form of silent accomplice. Have faith! Trust in the Christ!!, and he will give you the kind of strength that he found in doing the Father's will!!!


