## St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative

Why are Abortions Continuing to Rise?

"Following Dobbs, 41 states had laws on the books to protect the unborn in some form. Twelve now have comprehensive protections beginning at conception, while 28 have established gestational limits. Yet, despite this, abortion hasn't decreased. In fact, according to the pro-abortion Guttmacher Institute, abortions have increased more than 10% since Dobbs, rising from roughly 930,000 to over one million annually...How can abortion be on the rise when so many states have passed pro-life laws? The answer is chemical abortion—specifically, the abortion pill mifepristone, which now accounts for nearly two-thirds of all abortions. The Biden administration enabled this surge by eliminating critical FDA safety protocols and refusing to enforce longstanding federal laws, including the Comstock Act, which prohibits the mailing of abortion drugs. These actions were not incidental—they were designed to circumvent and neutralize the very state laws empowered by Dobbs."

### Fr. Henault Haitian Missions

Many of you are familiar with Fr. John Henault, Oblate Missionary of Mary Immaculate who has served in Haiti as a missionary for more than 61 years. Father is currently 89 years wise. He used to celebrate a 10AM Sunday Mass here at St. John's in August while he is here for his yearly family, medical and dentist visit.

For the sixth year in a row, Father was not be able to visit his family home in Sutton or us at St. John's because it is unsafe to travel in Haiti due to gangs and kidnappings. Consequently, he was once again unable to make his usual visits to local parishes for fundraising in support of his "St. Damien's Clinic" for Hansen's Disease (Leprosy). Because of this, St. John's is now one of the very few means of support for his clinic and without our help, his clinic will be forced to close.

St. John's Global Mission Apostolate has worked with Fr. Henault for many years. We want to continue to support Fr. Henault and are asking for donations to support him, his doctors, the clinic and their patients. A second collection will be held on the weekend of September 20 -21 for this. Additionally, anyone wishing to make a donation by cash or check (made out to *St. John's Mission Apostolate*) at any time can place it in an envelope marked for such and drop it in the regular collection basket or mail it to St. John's Parish. Father is most grateful to receive your donations to support him in his missionary work.

### CROSS ROADS

Wisdom 9:13-18; Psalm 90:3-6, 12-17; Philemon 9-10, 12-17; Luke 14:25-33

If we are not receptive to the Lord's gift of wisdom, we are unable to even begin to conceive, discern, or understand what the Lord intends. Without wisdom, we cannot fully be aware of our own limitations, or our own potential as intended by the providence of the Lord. Without wisdom, we can be prone to our own speculations. As mortal creations, such speculations are weak, and our plans can be misleading and unsure. Without wisdom, we can be prone to the burdens of earthly idols: our corruptible bodies, materialism, possessions, everyday concerns and worries, and reluctance to freely take up our own crosses and join them to the cross of Jesus. Without wisdom such burdens can weigh us down to the point that we might begin to walk a long and winding road, instead of the straight path to follow Christ, and to be true disciples who forgive those who have wronged us.

The promptings of wisdom help us to "number our days aright" as today's psalm suggests. We are the loved creations of our timeless Lord, for whom a thousand years is as yesterday, or as a mere watch of the night. Saint Paul, in today's letter to Philemon, is fully aware that his time is running out. He describes himself as an old man and a prisoner for Christ. He does not complain. Instead, he writes on behalf of Onesimus, a former slave belonging to Philemon. Paul describes Onesimus as somebody who Paul considered to be a son or a brother; and he writes that he is sending Onesimus back, not as a slave, but as a friend, and ardently urges Philemon to welcome Onesimus as a brother. Sometimes, Paul could be stern and bombastic. But the wisdom he accepted over time turned him into a true disciple of Christ, of truth, mercy, love, and fellowship, someone who has learned to freely take up his cross, and to put the Lord first.

Today's gospel can seem harsh. But when Christ seems to limit discipleship to those who hate father, mother, siblings, and one's own life, he is not advocating hate. God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is LOVE personified. Christ is advocating love by putting God first, because life in this world is fleeting. When we put God first, we share in the love of the Trinity, we pass it on to others, and our families and friends are more likely to do the same, and all can be more likely to share in the timeless eternity of our loving God.


