

Monday Zoom Rosary



Fr. Henault Haitian Missions

Many of you are familiar with Fr. John Henault, Oblate Missionary of Mary Immaculate who has served in Haiti as a missionary for more than 61 years. Father is currently 89 years wise. He used to celebrate a 10AM Sunday Mass here at St. John's in August while he is here for his yearly family, medical and dentist visit.

For the sixth year in a row, Father was not be able to visit his family home in Sutton or us at St. John's because it is unsafe to travel in Haiti due to gangs and kidnappings. Consequently, he was once again unable to make his usual visits to local parishes for fundraising in support of his "St. Damien's Clinic" for Hansen's Disease (Leprosy). Because of this, St. John's is now one of the very few means of support for his clinic and without our help, his clinic will be forced to close.

St. John's Global Mission Apostolate has worked with Fr. Henault for many years. We want to continue to support Fr. Henault and are asking for donations to support him, his doctors, the clinic and their patients. A second collection will be held NEXT WEEKEND for this. Additionally, anyone wishing to make a donation by cash or check (made out to St. John's Mission Apostolate) at any time can place it in an envelope marked for such and drop it in the regular collection basket or mail it to St. John's Parish. Father is most grateful to receive your donations to support him in his missionary work.

St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative Pastors and Attorneys Call on Congress to Protect Pro-Life State Laws

CROSS ROADS

Numbers 21: 4-9; Psalm 78: 1-2, 34-38; Philippians 2: 6-11; John 3: 13-17

From today's readings, the Church (in the Ordo) highlights this incite: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent, so must the Son of Man be lifted up. 'God highly exalted him' and made him Lord. How unforgettable are his deeds!" Having been freed from slavery in Egypt, the people wandered through the desert, and they complained about their hardships against Moses and against God. Punished by God with seraph serpents that bit and killed many, they asked Moses to pray for them. It was God who told Moses to make a serpent and to mount it on a pole. Moses obeyed and fashioned a serpent in bronze and mounted it on a pole. Thereafter, anyone who was bitten and looked at the serpent on the pole was saved and lived. This incident is a precursor of the sacrifice of Jesus, the Son of Man, on the cross: Jesus is the good shepherd who viewed his divinity as not something to be grasped, and emptied himself, so that those who believe in him may have eternal life. Jesus obeyed the Father without complaint for love of us. We all sometimes suffer sorrows, losses, and hardships. But we must not allow ourselves to resent what we suffer, or to doubt the love of God for us. Rather we must attach our sufferings, disappointments, and hardships to the sufferings of Christ. We too, for the greater glory of God, and for love of each other must embrace our own crosses and encourage and help others to embrace their crosses. As Jesus emptied himself for our sake, so we must empty ourselves by surrendering ourselves to him: body, soul, mind and heart, strengths and weaknesses. He is with us always!


