Fr. Henault Haitian Missions

Many of you are familiar with Fr. John Henault, Oblate Missionary of Mary Immaculate who has served in Haiti as a missionary for more than 61years. Father is currently 89 years wise. He used to celebrate a 10AM Sunday Mass here at St. John's in August while he is here for his yearly family, medical and dentist visit.

For the sixth year in a row, Father was not be able to visit his family home in Sutton or us at St. John's because it is unsafe to travel in Haiti due to gangs and kidnappings. Consequently, he was once again unable to make his usual visits to local parishes for fundraising in support of his "St. Damien's Clinic" for Hansen's Disease (Leprosy). Because of this, St. John's is now one of the very few means of support for his clinic and without our help, his clinic will be forced to close.

St. John's Global Mission Apostolate has worked with Fr. Henault for many years. We want to continue to support Fr. Henault and are asking for donations to support him, his doctors, the clinic and their patients. A second collection will be held THIS WEEKEND for this. Additionally, anyone wishing to make a donation by cash or check (made out to St. John's Mission Apostolate) at any time can place it in an envelope marked for such and drop it in the regular collection basket or mail it to St. John's Parish. Father is most grateful to receive your donations to support him in his missionary work.

St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative MA Gov Maura Healy Signs Legislation to Expand Abortion Out-of-State

Massachusetts Gov. Maura Healey has signed legislation expanding the state's 2022 "shield law," enabling abortion providers to prescribe and ship abortion pills, including mifepristone, into states where the procedure is restricted or banned. The law conceals the identities of those involved in such "telehealth abortions," even if they violate other states' laws. Myrna Maloney Flynn, president of Massachusetts Citizens for Life, criticized the measure for protecting illegal activity and endangering women's health, while reaffirming MCFL's commitment to life-affirming alternatives like abortion pill reversal. 08/15/25 masscitizensforlife.org

CROSS ROADS

Amos: 8:4-7; Psalm 113:1-2, 4-8; 1Timothy 2:1-8; Luke 16:1-13

The words of Amos in today's first reading cry out against those who exploit the poor and the needy for the sake of greed, and serving themselves rather than the Lord. Giving ourselves to God rather than riches and the things of this world is when we can truly pray blamelessly for those in need, for those who are victims of injustice, violence, and persecution. Amos and today's psalm tell us that The Lord raises the needy and the poor and will never forget the wrongs done by people who victimize the poor and the needy. The Lord wants all to be saved, and for all to live peaceful and tranquil lives. But as we know, especially in the last few days, that the ways of the world we live in often is not one of peace and tranquility. The things of this world cannot give us peace and tranquility. Only the Lord can give that to us if we are faithful to his will and his ways, and we accept the truth, and the light. Many who embrace the ways of the world instead of the Lord's truth, resort to anxiety, fear, and violence. Thus, it is humanity that has created fear, anxiety, and violence. Like the prophets of old, who spoke the truth, anyone who does so in our times can be persecuted for doing so by those who reject the truth, who hold on tightly to their pleasures, possessions, power, and their way and station in life (especially if it is immoral). Are we expected to make our families poor? No. But we have a responsibility to do what we can when we can, to be as generous as we can while living up to our family's needs, to stand for justice and for respect for the dignity of the needy, and for the right of all to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. Putting the will and the ways of the Lord first will help us. The words of an old priest friend of mine, who I think was quoting Henry Nouwen, say it all: "Live more simply so that others can simply live."


