St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative

Australian Bishops Oppose Surrogacy, Speak for Motherhood, as Surrogacy Expands

"Speaking to the effects of surrogacy on children, the bishops emphasized that every child has the right to be raised by their biological parents. "Every child has the right to be conceived, carried, and raised within the stable, loving bond of its biological mother and father. To deliberately bypass this context is to violate the child's inherent dignity and best interests," the bishops stated. The prelates further underscored how surrogacy undermines the sacred role of motherhood. "Surrogacy reduces this sacred role to a service contract--an arrangement that denies women's full humanity," the letter continued. "Surrogacy attempts to divide a woman's body from her identity, as though she could be a vessel without being a mother."

Members of the Knights of Columbus and St. John's Pro Life Initiative will be collecting signatures after Masses this weekend to put a question on the ballot to **stop taxpayer funding of abortions in Massachusetts**. Please stop by and sign the petition. Note that the paperwork is submitted by town so identify your town before signing the petition if you are from a town other than Hopkinton. Please follow the instructions provided as an incorrectly signed petition can invalidate the entire form and all the other signatures on it. Thank you for your consideration.

CROSS ROADS

Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4; Psalm 95:1-2, 6-9; 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14; Luke 17:5-10

In today's reading from Habakkuk, we hear of a plea that is something all of us may have done at one time or another: complain about what we are going through and asking why our prayers do not seem to be answered. But the Lord does not rebuke him. He promises that the day will come, and it will not disappoint, and the Lord urges him to wait, to be patient. For all of us, faith and trust in the Lord are essential to the process of getting through difficult times and to attaining a level of peace that endures. Only the Lord can do that for us. The peace that the world offers is fleeting, passes away; and can lead us into distractions that cause even greater anxiety.

It is the Lord who is the Rock of our salvation. Faith is the gracious gift He gives to us. It is a gift that cannot be earned or bought. It can only be accepted. The Lord also gives us the gift of the Holy Spirit who strengthens us in troubled times and helps us to join our troubles and suffering to the Passion that Christ suffered for us. In so doing we build a relationship with Christ, one that we can trust and thankfully rejoice in. But it is not easy with the distractions and the callous and vile noise that we hear every day from around the world, even after somebody like Charlie Kirk (a true modern-day prophet of truth, faith, hope, life, the word of God, and caring for all people troubled by modern times and urges). For some, that may seem like a stretch. However, like the prophets of old, he was counterculture: speaking truth that many young men and women flocked to. But some did not want to hear the truth because it would mean giving up some of their behaviors, pleasures or power. And like many of the prophets of old, he was persecuted, criticized, and murdered. He went beyond what he knew we are all commanded to do. But to this day, thousands of young people are joining his movement of truth and life. The fallen seed is bearing much fruit!

In today's gospel the apostles asked Jesus to increase their faith. His answer applies to all of us: Do more than obey the Commandments. Be aware of your surroundings and people who need help, and for whom words of consolation, hope, and encouragement and small works of love and service can mean so much. Even faith the size of a tiny mustard seed, by the grace of God can accomplish much.
