Sobering Abortion Statistics for England and Wales "After a recent report revealed that nearly 30% of all conceptions in England and Wales ended in abortion in 2022, the archbishop of Liverpool called for efforts to create a culture that protects unborn children and supports parents in need. The statement from Archbishop Sherrington... comes just weeks after the UK Parliament voted to decriminalize abortion up to and during birth...According to a July 2025 Right to Life News press release, 40.3% of all conceptions in the city of Liverpool in 2022 ended in abortion. PURGATORY—THERE AND BACK AGAIN

What is Purgatory?

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of Heaven.

The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned.

-- Catechism of the Catholic Church 1030, 1031

How do we know Purgatory exists?

The existence of Purgatory follows two facts; our imperfection on earth and our perfection in Heaven. Rev. 21:27, Mt 5:8

"I would go so far as to say that if there was no Purgatory, then one would have to invent it, for who would dare say of himself that he was able to stand directly before God?"

Who are the Holy Souls in Purgatory?

Most of us who die in the grace of God as His friends, but still imperfect and require a "purification" before entering Heaven. These Holy Souls want to go to Purgatory for that purification. They are called holy because they are not yet perfect, they are on the way to Heaven.

Why do the Holy Souls need our Help?

The Church teaches that the Holy Souls in Purgatory cannot help or pray for themselves. Only the prayers, sacrifices and sufferings of the living can bring relief and consolation in attaining their eternal reward.

What can we do to help the Holy Souls?

The best way to help our brothers and sisters in Purgatory is to have the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered up for them or devoutly assist at Holy Mass for their relief or release. Make the stations of the cross for their consolation. Pray the rosary, the chaplet of Divine Mercy. By gaining indulgences (c.c.c. 1471-1479). Offering up our pain, self-denials, and suffering. Eucharistic adoration, offer up works or mercy, almsgiving and fasting.


