

St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative **Pro-Life Experts Discuss Christian Response to IVF**

"The panelists then pivoted to the topic of IVF, in light of the recent White House move to expand funding for IVF and other responses to infertility. 'I am a reproductive endocrinologist', Dr. Lauren Rubel shared. 'But for much of my career, I did do in vitro fertilization which is combining eggs and sperm outside of the body to create embryos. And I absolutely believed that what I was doing was the best way forward to help those couples, that IVF is pro-life, because it helps create life, right? That's how I started.' She continued, 'I'll tell you, quite frankly, after a period of doing this, I was the head of a division in a large hospital system, and I was starting to feel more and more and more the weight of my actions and what I was doing.' Rubel explained that many couples who pursue IVF do not have 'a true diagnosis' relating to the underlying cause of their infertility. 'I said, you know, we just have to kind of move forward and this should be the fix. But it truly is a Band-Aid. And I could sense that I wasn't healing anyone. I wasn't addressing those root causes,' she said. 'I was intimately involved and really felt like I was playing God. I felt and realized that, in fact, what in vitro fertilization does is it creates embryos, which are humans in their earliest stages of development. And, unfortunately, I was making decisions of life and death for those embryos,' she continued. CROSS ROADS

By Deacon Tony Malachi 3:19-20; Psalm 98:5-9; 2Thessalonians 3:7-12; Luke 21:5-9

Today we are reminded of the second coming of the Lord and the signs that would precede the last day. Those signs, however, would not predict the day or the time. Today's reading from Malachi does predict some of the results: the proud and all evil doers will be stubble. But those who lived in fear of the Lord (those who lived in awed respect of the Lord according to His will and His ways, in humble obedience, and perseverance) would be healed by the sun of justice, because, as today's psalm says, the Lord rules and judges with justice and equity. In other words, all are ruled and judged by the same measure according to what they do and what they fail to do.

In the reading from Thessalonians, we see how Saint Paul and his helpers set an example of how to live, work, and help one another. As Paul and his helpers followed the example of Christ in His patient endurance and perseverance in the face of persecution and His Passion, Paul and his helpers set an example of endurance and perseverance in the way that he and his helpers served the Thessalonians. He told them and us that we should be busy with work that helps one another, and refrain from disorderly conduct as busy bodies, minding the business of others. Paul went as far as declaring that "if any one was unwilling to work, neither should that person eat." Paul instructed and urged that all should "work quietly and eat their own food."

In today's gospel, Jesus warned his disciples that the day was coming "... when there would not be left a stone upon another stone. The last day would be preceded by false prophets, wars among nations and kingdoms, earthquakes, famines, plagues, awesome sights and mighty signs from the sky. The disciples would be persecuted and handed over to the authorities by parents, brothers, relatives and friends. They would be hated because of HIS name; and some would be put to death. But in the end, when the Lord comes again, they would emerge victorious because of their perseverance. By the power of the Holy Spirit we too can be humbly patient (as Jesus was) in the face of persecution and hatred. When we act according to the will and ways of the Lord, Christ lives in us and we too can face such things and our daily challenges by the power of the Spirit; and in the end emerge victorious as we conscientiously fulfill our Christian obligations.


