There will be a holy hour of Divine Mercy every Monday from 6:30-7:30PM in the lower church. All are welcome.


Third Thursday Holy Hour for Priests

St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative Steve's Testimony as Shared by His Mother, Part II

(Steve is in the Navy, married and an abortion survivor. He sent this letter to his mother.) "I know abortion is everywhere. People talk about it like it's just a political issue or a routine decision. But for me, it's never been abstract. It's deeply spiritual. I didn't just hear a story today. I felt a loss. A deep, wrenching loss. I found myself grieving for [aborted] children I never met and never will. I do not know their names. I will never see their faces. But my soul recognized them. It was like something in me brushed up against their absence, and I could not turn away. What hit me hardest wasn't just that they died, but that no one seemed to grieve them. Not even their parents. They were unwanted, discarded, erased. But somehow, I still loved them. I loved those babies for the ones who couldn't or wouldn't. I mourned them like a father mourns the invisible. That grief wasn't mine to carry, but I carried it anyway. And then something happened." To be continued in next week's bulletin. CROSS ROADS

Isaiah 35: 1-6, 10; Psalm 146: 6-10; James 5:7-10; Matthew 11: 2-11

It is the Third Sunday of Advent, otherwise known as Gaudete Sunday. We continue preparation for Christmas with joyful expectation, and hopefully with patience, as we await the commemoration of the fulfillment of God coming to live among us in the person of Jesus, His Advent. We know Advent too be a time to prepare. But there is a dictionary meaning to Advent as the arrival or beginning of an important event or situation. The Lord coming to live among us is as important and meaningful an event as an event can be! And we do so with the understanding that it is the fulfillment of scripture that He comes to save us, and to heal us. There would be signs and wonders of the Lord healing the blind and the deaf and bringing people back to life. But the Lord does so with a deeper and more lofty purpose: that we might hear and accept the truth, that we might overcome the noise of this world and hear and recognize His Word; and be inspired to live according to His will and His ways. As our Creator, we belong to Him; and we are called to live His way, not our way, not the way of the world.

With all the distractions, uncertainties, dangers and challenges of this world we can lose our way, be blind and deaf to the will of God. We can forget that we too can become messengers of the good news as John the Baptist was. Patience, peace, and quiet is important to recognizing and living by the promptings of the Lord. In our times we always have the Lord with us in the Eucharist, and the experience of His never-ending mercy in Confession. As we move toward the fourth Sunday in Advent, let us rejoice with patience and with some degree of silent reverence. Let us practice some silence and know that He is God, that He is with us always, so that we can appreciate His presence and the reason for the season.


