First Saturday Devotion



CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony

Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14; Psalm 128: 1-5; Colossians 3: 12-21; Matthew 2: 13-15, 19-23

Today we honor and learn from the example of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. The Church teaches that the family life is rooted in the unconditional love of God. There is no greater example of this than the Holy Family. Jesus, who is God with us was given birth and nurtured by our Blessed Mother, and Saint Joseph took on the responsibility given to him to protect and provide for them. Jesus, the incarnation of the Word of God, humbled himself to become one of us, and to be lovingly obedient to both Mary and Joseph. We all are called to do the same in our relationships as offspring, husbands, and wives.

But the Holy Family is not simply an example of what is expected of us within our immediate family, but also and example of how we should care for and treat each other within the family of the Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church of Christ: with loving Kindness, humility, compassion, patience, forgiveness, encouragement, affirmation, and the peace of Christ. The family is a microcosm of the Church and is at the heart of what the larger Church family strives to be. That is one of the reasons why the traditional family and the Church have been under attack by so-called modern culture.

To combat that evil persecution, let us follow the example of The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Each of them simply did what God the Father asked them to do. Let us do that! And let us not seek the praise of other people. Let us simply do what the Lord asks of us: to follow his commands because it is the right thing to do. To quote Saint John Berchmans (a Jesuit scholastic known for his piety and faithfulness): "Our true worth does not consist in what human beings think of us. What we really are consists in what God knows us to be." In the end, that is the only thing that matters.


